

EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA INTENTIONAL COMMUNITY

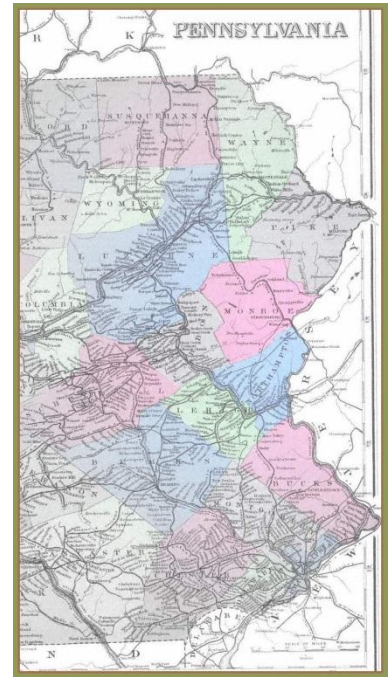
A multi-generational community, guided by ethical and moral principles, that nurtures sustainability, learning and service.

An Investment in Your Future...

The form of organization/corporate structure is yet to be determined. One option may be a shareholder model. Another option is a direct purchase / private property model. There may be other options. We see this as an investment in your family's future – one you can be proud of owning and passing on!

In an exploratory meeting in February 2013 participants spoke about their vision, what inspired them to pursue this, what would make them happy and what were their fears going forward. Smaller groups brainstormed a vision statement and then moved on to our ideas for mission/activities that the community could pursue.

We discussed what kind of structures and land support those activities and other aspects of the physical set-up. We talked about the activities that each of us personally are interested in pursuing - what we could see ourselves doing within the community. Finally we agreed to certain tasks going forward and a short term plan for the future
